#### 2021 — Our 180th Anniversary Year

Dear Friends and Family's of Woodland,

We find ourselves taking a look back over this milestone year for the cemetery and realize just how far we have come from our rural garden setting cemetery to a cemetery encompassing a Historic District, three buildings on the National Register of Historic Places, over 111,000 interments and a recreational and educational resource for Dayton and Ohio.

Woodland is always changing, from the seasonal changes mother nature provides to industry standards and norms. We also find ourselves changing the landscape of the cemetery in order to offer additional burial and cremation options for the families we serve. We are creating new pathways and are adding new garden space to supplement the natural landscape and in turn that gives a home to the pollinators: butterflies and bees.

## Woodland Cemetery and Arboretum—Celebrating 180 years of service


#### February 2021

How lovely the low setting sun looks upon the Woodland pond.

#### **March 2021**

The Chapel was wrapped in scaffolding as work began on restoring the exterior of the historic building. LRT Restoration Technologies worked diligently to physically tap, mark, and measure the 500+ stones that give both the historic Chapel and Administration Building its Richardsonian Romanesque style. The contractor also digitally scanned the highly ornamental red sandstone elements as well as the decorative sunburst and herringbone motifs that adorn the Chapel facades and will create mock-ups for the decorative motif replacements. The carefully matched replacement stones will be on site in February of 2022

and the heavy lifting will officially begin. The anticipated exterior restoration completion date is May of 2022. Once the masonry restoration is complete, the recently restored stained glass windows will be placed back in their original location. The stained glass windows will then be protected by new and custom storm windows.





Progress on the Tiffany windows was coming along nicely. We cannot say thank you enough to the artisans at BeauVerre Riordan Studios in Middletown who have taken such care of our windows. Their meticulous restoration work will be a sight to behold once the windows are replaced in the Chapel.







## Woodland Cemetery and Arboretum—Celebrating 180 years of service

#### May 2021

The cemetery is always at its busiest in May as we clean up from the winter months, welcome spring flowers, and prepare for Memorial Day weekend. One remarkable woman and two notable brothers received an upgrade to their grave sites. Erma Bombeck received a plaque as directed by her children. The Dayton Garden Club updated the work they did in 2006 by reworking the landscaping and garden at the site of the Wright Brothers grave.

The new plaque on Erma's rock reads:

"I've seen the motherhood role played by men grandparents, friends, aunts, and even social workers. It doesn't matter who plays it. What does matter is that when the curtain goes up each day, someone is there to dazzle, ad-lib, support, comfort, listen, and fulfill what I feel is the most important role I'll ever be offered in my life. It's the only one I'll be remembered for."

The plants and flowers that had been in the space were replanted in gardens including at Carillon Historical Park. The granite pavers that had once been the walkway around the Wright family graves were repurposed and used to create a walkway to the Johnny Morehouse monument.

Interior work in the Chapel began with an evaluation of the plaster walls and the interior stone and brick structure.

By mid-June the Wright Brothers plantings began filling in their new home and the grave site was looking great.

On June 27th, the 149th birthday of Paul Laurence Dunbar, community members along with administrators and students of Dunbar High School in Dayton flew their flag over the gravesite of Paul Laurence Dunbar. The first school to do so in the "Fly your Flag" program co-sponsored by Woodland Cemetery and the National Park Service in Dayton.

#### **July 2021**

Another visit was taken to BeauVerre Riordan Studios to see the progress on the Tiffany windows. Down to the last section of the signature window, you can see how much dirt settled within the layers of glass at the bottom.

Volunteer Terry Buchanan worked between 12 and 15 hours each month to keep the grounds, flowers and plantings at Lookout looking beautiful and well-manicured. Thank you Terry for your service to Woodland.

In late July, Woodland received an updated National Aviation Heritage Area sign and map locating all of the aviation sites in and around the greater Miami Valley area.
