




Welcome to Woodland:

If you need help finding where someone is buried, need directions to a particular area, or have questions about pre-planning or funeral services, Woodland's Staff is here to assist you!


What's New

<u>History Mystery Murder & Mayhem:</u>

Who confessed on their deathbed of murdering 18-year-old Christine Kett? Did Rose Shafor really dress up as a man to help her lover commit a crime? Who killed Julius Kruse? Woodland is seeking volunteers to give presentations to community groups on subjects such as local history, notable biographies, and trees.




