



## 147 Years Ago at Woodland

#### The Burial of Matilda Stanley...

Matilda, matriarch of the Stanley family, died January 15<sup>th</sup>, 1878, in Vicksburg, MS. To "retain the natural aspect of life," her body was embalmed before being returned to Dayton by train.

In order to allow enough time for the large, widespread Stanley family & related clans to come together for Matilda's burial, her body was held in Woodland's Receiving Vault for eight months. Each day, Matilda's daughters would visit her there with fresh flowers.

The burial of Matilda Stanley, on September 15 <sup>th</sup>, 1878, made front page news. It remains, to this day, the largest funeral service ever held at Woodland Cemetery.

Somewhere between 10 & 20 thousand people were here, including more than a few looky-loos hoping to catch a glimpse of exotic rituals. A group of men and boys even climbed to the top of the Receiving Vault; sitting with their legs dangling over as the pallbearers brought Matilda's coffin out.

This "irreverent mob" would be, as *the Cincinnati Enquirer* put it, "greatly disappointed".

"Pshaw," said one such lady as she returned from the cemetery; "I wish I'd stayed at home for all I saw. Why, I can see better funerals than that any day in the week, when the crowds are not nearly so great, and I can enjoy them more fully!"

Though much better attended, Matilda Stanley's funeral service was not unlike many traditional Christian services. The only unusual thing to happen was when one of Matilda's daughters threw herself upon her mother's coffin and wept, and even this was calmed by a few kind words.









Marianna L. Lowe (1876 – 1903)

Woodland chapel's 1904 renovation by Tiffany Studios was made possible, in part, by a then-anonymous donation of \$10,000 by Henry C. Lowe in memory of his beloved only daughter, Marianna.

Marianna and her parents are laid to rest in section 55, lot 6 at Woodland Cemetery.

In 1892, Tiffany patented 'Favrile' (meaning 'hand-wrought') glass—a method of manipulating molten glass to achieve a range of color & effect.

Favrile glass made it possible to use techniques often found in painting. Using the unique features of each piece, Tiffany's artists were able to create the appearance of foliage, the effect of sunlight on water, or a distant horizon.

To go into much detail about the many fine qualities of Tiffany glass would take several more *Minutes*; suffice it to say that we encourage our readers to learn more.






