
An Evening Amongst the Trees and Gravestones



Parking is available both outside our main gates on Woodland Ave. and along our main drive.

Restrooms are **not** available after 5 pm.

Before 5 pm., visitors may use restrooms inside the Woodland Mausoleum, just up the hill from the plaza.

All tours require a reservation and there is a suggested \$10 donation.

Meet your tour group outside the cemetery's administration office on the Eichelberger Plaza.

Tours will continue rain or shine; though we will cancel for storms.

Happy Birthday!

Charles Soule Jr.

During the Civil War, Charles Soule Jr. enlisted in the Ohio Volunteer Infantry, where he was promoted to First Lieutenant.

After being wounded at the battle of Shiloh, Soule resigned his post; later on, he became Captain of Co. E, 140th Regiment, O.V.I.

Like his father (Charles Soule Sr.) and sisters (Clara & Octavia), Charles Soule Jr. was a painter who specialized in portraits.

Rev. Edward Puff

Rev. Puff was a 1936 graduate of Miami

University, Oxford, Ohio, and graduated from Union Theological Seminary in New York City with a Master of Divinity Degree in 1939. Over the course of his long career, Rev. Puff officiated more than 5,500 funerals and over 1,600 burials in Woodland Cemetery; most famously, that of Orville Wright in February of 1948.

In 2004, Rev. Puff was inducted into the Walk of Fame at the Dayton Aviation Heritage National Historical Park located on West Third St.

Rev. Puff died at the age of 91 in 2006. His final resting place is in section 101, lot 1829—just steps away from the Wright family lot.

Not into public speaking? Consider getting involved with our horticulture team, or assisting with special events & research projects.




Tours & More:


