Eighty years ago, World War II was ended. Six years of globe-spanning conflict, starvation and disease had claimed the lives of an estimated 80 million people—approximately 3 percent of the world's population. The vast majority of those who died were civilians.

Prisoner of War

While war raged overseas, rationing began here in Dayton in May of 1942. Classified as an essential health service, Woodland fared better than many of her neighbors. Gasoline & tires became high priority items. The City Parks & Playgrounds division was permitted to use several acres in what would become Woodland's southern district as Victory Gardens.

The trouble was a lack of manpower—anyone who was not in the military was expected to go to work for war production. To help keep up with the cemetery's grounds keeping, Woodland decided to think outside the box.

Promising that they would be treated well and have access to plenty of pasture, the cemetery 'borrowed' about 100 sheep. Unfortunately, the sheep largely ignored the lawn, preferring instead to munch on ornamental plants which did not agree with them!


If you need help finding where someone is buried, need directions to a particular area, or have questions about pre-planning or funeral services, Woodland's Staff is here to assist you!


